The Oak Orchard Riverdale Boys and Girls Club serves 97 area children and has a waiting list for 30 more. The Club provides after school and summer child care for children in kindergarten through age 13. A Keystone Club serves teens aged 14-18. The program focuses on helping youth advance academically, and develop healthy lifestyles and good character and citizenship.

"We do our best to help our children have a positive place to be after school and in the summer," states Charnick. "These funds will help us continue to scholarship as needed."
