Long Neck Sunrise Rotary Club's 9th Annual Charity Golf Tournament Raises Over \$20,000 to Support Local and Rotary International Initiatives

(Millsboro) (June 12, 2018) — It was a beautiful day at The Peninsula on The Indian River Bay for The Long Neck Sunrise Rotary Club's 9th Annual Charity Golf Outing on Thursday, June 7, 2018. The sun was shining, temperatures were moderate and the winds were not too strong. This signature event is the club's main fund-raising function, where all proceeds are used to support Rotary's Global Polio Eradication Initiative, Habitat for Humanity – Sussex County, The Delaware Burn Camp, Long Neck Area Youth Programs and Organizations, and The Greater Long Neck Community with Projects and Programs to Foster Growth and Improve Its Quality of Life. This year the tournament is netting over \$20,000 from the event sponsors and 98 golfers.

On-course competitions include Four "Holes in One" sponsored by Terry Megee of Megee Motors with no winners this year. The day was capped by a gourmet dinner at the Peninsula where retired tournament founder, George Fetrow, was acknowledged for his work over the years to make this "one of the best" charity golf tournaments in Delaware. Next year's tournament is scheduled for June 6, 2019.
